FALL & SPRING RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules shall remain in
effect for the 2015- 2016 season

June 1, 2015

MISSION STATEMENT

The objective of the Hobe Sound Ravens shall be to imprint firmly in the children of the Hobe Sound community, the ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, loyalty, courage and respect for authority, so that they may be well adjusted, stronger and happier children and will grow to be good decent, healthy and trustworthy citizens. This will be done through youth sports programs.

We will provide them a foundation and encourage them to better their football skills both on the field and off the field as long as they have the desire and willingness to play this game. Our goal is to increase their knowledge, skill and mental ability in hopes they will take this game to next level whether it be high school football or beyond. The sky is the limit.

ELIGIBILITY

Primary eligibility for both seasons is determined by the participant's age as of July 31, of the current season.

There will be no changes of division granted after initial registration without consent of the Hobe Sound Ravens Football Commissioner without an extenuating circumstance as deemed by the Executive Board of Directors. This is to protect and preserve the integrity of the Hobe Sound Ravens philosophy.

Eligibility for fall shall be ages 4 through 15, not to exceed 15 by December 31 of the current season. **4 year olds must turn 5 between August 1 and December 31.

Eligibility for spring shall be determined by the age/weight restrictions dictated by the FSYFL.

Fall Tackle Age/Weight Divisions:

Flag Division:	4, 5, 6, 7 years of age*
Lower Division:	7, 8, 9, 10 years of age*
Middle Division:	10, 11, 12*, 13** years of age
Upper Division:	12, 13, 14, 15 years of age

*Any child in their final year of a division will need Board approval to move up a division. If your child elects to go up a division he/she may not move back down. There will be no other moves permitted between divisions or teams without an extenuating circumstance as deemed by the Board. All requests must be made in writing and submitted to hs_ravens@comcast.net.

**Players 13 years old weighing 115 lbs. or less will be permitted to play in the Middle Division. Weight must be verified during Regular Fall Registration. If not, they will be placed in the Upper Division.

There are no geographical boundaries for participation in the Hobe Sound Ravens however please be informed that in compliance with Martin County Parks & Recreation 85% of all participants will be residents of Martin County.

No football player/cheerleader will be allowed to participate in the Hobe Sound Ravens without a complete registration form, birth certificate and a biological parent/legal guardian photo ID on file with the Hobe Sound Ravens. Biological parent is to include adoptive parents.

If a Board Member, Coach, football player or cheerleader is arrested during the season, they could be placed on suspension until the case is resolved.

REGISTRATION

Registration shall commence and close at a date, time and place and fees are established by the Hobe Sound Ravens BOD prior to commencement of each season.

Each fall tackle football player will receive a practice jersey, a game day jersey, supplemental medical insurance and the THE HOBE SOUND RAVENS fee.

Each fall flag player will receive practice t-shirt, game day shirts and shorts, supplemental medical insurance and the THE HOBE SOUND RAVENS fee.

Each cheerleader will receive practice t-shirt and soffe shorts, cheer uniform, supplemental medical insurance and the THE HOBE SOUND RAVENS fee.

REGISTRATION FOR SPRING 2016:

Spring football will continue to be in conjunction with the league regulations of the FSYFL. We will not publish spring fees until the FSYFL publishes age/weight requirements for the 2016 Season.

However, the manner in which the Hobe Sound Ravens conduct spring signups will change this fall. In order to manage our growth and continue to support the program with the best equipment both for players and development, we must cap our signups starting in 2016.

Signups will work in the following manner:

1. Fall Ravens window for signups for spring season – October 15, 2015 – October 31, 2015
2. Returning Ravens from spring 2015 – November 1, 2015 – November 13, 2015
3. Open signups to new prospects – November 14, 2015 until full.

If group 1 doesn't signup during their respective registration slot, they must wait until open signups. If group 2 doesn't signup during their respective registration slot, they must wait until open signups. Open signups will remain open until the program reaches its cap. More information will be released as the spring season approaches.

REGISTRATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Hobe Sound Ravens is a not-for-profit association and we will do our best to accommodate individuals who are unable to pay our fees to play. We raise money in order to help those in need however due to equipment costs we are limited in the amount of need we can provide. You may inquire about financial assistance in writing to hs_ravens@comcast.net. We do not give 100% scholarships to any individual as we feel it is important for each player/parent to accept some responsibility in the contribution to the Hobe Sound Ravens.

REGISTRATION DOCUMENTATION

A registration form shall be completed for each participant by their biological parent/legal guardian. Court documentation showing legal guardianship is required.

The Player Agent or other authorized Hobe Sound Raven representative shall verify all information including name, league age and date of birth at the time of registration.

A medical release shall authorize the Hobe Sound Ravens to provide medical attention as deemed to be in the best interest of the participant. This medical release shall be completed for each prospective participant at the time of registration.

The biological parent/legal guardian shall agree to volunteer a minimum of 4 hours during the season working in either the concession or on the chain crew per child in the program as scheduled by the Team Parent.

The biological parent/guardian shall agree to follow the Hobe Sound Ravens Parent Code of Conduct and encourage family members and guests to do the same.

If registration payment by either check or credit card is returned for a lack of funds or closed account a fee, to be determined by the BOD, will be added to the amount of the registration fee to be paid in cash. The child unfortunately will not be allowed to participate until all payments are paid in full.

Participants registered between the opening and closing of registration shall be eligible for the primary draft. Registration for fall football and cheer is on a first come, first serve basis. No spaces for fall football or cheer will be reserved for returning players/cheerleaders. However, please note Hobe Sound Ravens Spring Select will change beginning fall 2015 for signups for spring 2016.

PLAYER DRAFTS

Beginning with the fall 2015, the Hobe Sound Ravens will conduct player drafts for all divisions with participants that exceed the amount of a 20-member roster. This method will also be carried over into spring 2016 however in the Hobe Sound Ravens Select season, players will be placed according to their participant score rating determined by their fall performance or if they are returning their skills assessment conducted at our annual December combine.

PRIMARY DRAFT

Players having participated the previous year shall be ineligible for the primary draft and shall be assigned to the same team for which they participated in the previous year, if eligibility is met. This rule will commence during fall of 2016. For the fall 2015 season and spring 2016, we will conduct primary drafts.

Participants must actively attend all days of tryouts and/or evaluations and must be seen by all available teams to be eligible for the primary draft. If unable to attend, the participant shall enter the supplemental draft.

If the majority of the coaches agree that a player who has missed tryouts should be “draftable” player...then they will be placed in the Primary Draft instead of the Supplemental Draft.

TRYOUTS

Tryouts or evaluations shall begin and end at a designated date determined by the BOD.

Fall 2015 Evaluation: July 20, 2015 – JV Reed Park 9 AM – 11 AM

Spring 2016 Evaluation: December 12, 2015 – The Benjamin School 8 AM – 12 PM

PRIMARY DRAFT LIST

A committee comprised of; the Registrar, Football Commissioner, Operations, Coaches of Divisions and the President of the Hobe Sound Ravens shall compile a primary draft list of eligible players for each division. The list will include, name, age, evaluation score, football experience and Raven experience as well as sibling information.

The Football Commissioner in cooperation with the BOD shall designate the date, time and place of the Primary Draft.

PRIMARY DRAFT PROCEDURE

The following is the procedure in the manner the Hobe Sound Ravens will conduct the Primary Draft for the fall 2015 season. Spring 2016 season will be updated after the commencement of the first BOD meeting including spring 2016 board members.

 - ii. HSR Football Commissioner
 - iii. HSR President
 - iv. HSR Registrar

Draft Selection

- A. Each Head Coach/Asst. Coaches children will be placed on their respective teams.
- B. All players will be drafted by position.
 - i. Quarterbacks will be drafted first and divided accordingly after the first team chooses their player.
 - ii. Backfield positions will be drafted second, followed by centers, kickers, tight ends, linebackers, ending with offensive and defensive lineman.
- C. Siblings playing in the same division will automatically be assigned to the same team at the time the first sibling is chosen unless the biological parent/guardian has requested they play on separate teams or separate divisions.

The Hobe Sound Ravens Secretary or designee shall record draft selections in order of their occurrence. Immediately upon conclusion of the primary draft, the list shall be compared and validated as correct.

If the number of players left in the primary draft is less than the number of teams in the last round of the draft, the remaining players will be placed in the supplemental draft.

Supplemental Drafts

Supplemental drafts will be held for players who did not qualify for primary draft. The Player Agent or designee using a random procedure will conduct supplemental drafts. Supplemental draftee's name will be drawn at random in a continuing order.

Trades

Trading will commence immediately following the supplemental draft and shall conclude fifteen (15) minutes thereafter. The trades are monitored by the committee however are conducted by the actual coaches of the teams. A player can only be traded for a player of like position.

The Secretary of the Hobe Sound Ravens shall keep record of all trades. All trades shall be made one-for-one trades.

FALL SEASON ONLY

The following pages refer to fall ball only. The spring season will continue to operate under the FSYFL rules of play however for teams we will limit roster size starting with fall 2015 signups for the spring season.

FALL TEAMS ONLY

Teams shall consist of a Head Coach and a maximum of four(4) certified Assistant Coaches. There shall be a player roster of no more than 22 players.

One water boy/girl, under the age of 16 shall be optional team member. Optional team members are not to be issued, loaned or given team jerseys.

Absolutely no food or drink will be allowed on the track or field unless designated by the league.

Team Practice

Definition of practice: Any gathering of players and at least 1 Coach shall be defined as a practice and

must be held at a BOD approved site.

Team volunteers are permitted to assist with practice. If they are not NYSCA certified they are not permitted to conduct contact drills. Volunteers must be over the age of 16. Any volunteer over the age of 18 must complete a background check through the league and must pay the fee.

If a Head Coach has a special event that he/she would like to take their team to *i.e.: High school football game, Movies, etc.* This will have to be approved by the BOD at least 1 week prior to the event.

Scrimmages are restricted to 1 per week.

There will be absolutely no practices on Friday or Sunday except when designated by the BOD. A Board Member must be present at one of the approved sites for **ALL** practices.

Practice Times

Practice shall be held Monday – Thursday during the hours of 5:00pm and 8:00pm, for a maximum of 2 hours, as the field is open at those times.

Practice Limitations

Minimum hours per week	Tackle:	six (6)	Flag:	two (2)
Maximum hours per week	Tackle:	eight (8)	Flag:	four (4)

Any tackle team choosing to practice the minimum 6 hour practice, players must attend 100% of practice to be eligible

Any coach practicing in excess of the maximum allowed time per week shall be subject to disciplinary action.

Tackle football practices shall be held a maximum of four days a week and the player must **actively** participate in practice to participate in Saturday's game. All tackle football participants must attend $\frac{3}{4}$ of scheduled practices.

Cheerleaders and Flag participants are to participate in at least $\frac{1}{2}$ of scheduled practices.

Cancellation of a practice due to inclement weather, as approved by the BOD, shall count as a practice played. If a coach cancels practice it counts as an absence.

The coach is responsible for insuring all of his/her players have been picked up after practice. The coach must be present until all his/her children have gone home. SEE DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Practice Equipment

Players shall practice with all approved equipment during contact drills.

Equipment for football shall include helmet, shoulder pads, practice pants, pant pads, and mouthpiece.

Mouthpieces must be attached to the helmet at all times.

Mouthpieces cannot be clear or white in color.

*Protective cup to be supplied by parent/legal guardian and are optional.

Special equipment (knee braces, prosthesis etc. as determined by FHSAA as approved equipment) shall be approved by the Player Agent prior to the player's participation in contact drills and scrimmages.

Player Agent/the Hobe Sound Ravens may deny use of special equipment or require a written authorization from participant's physician before being allowed to use said equipment. This is for each game and to be written by the treating physician.

COACHES

Selection of Coaches

Coaches shall make a written application and submit such application to the President of the league or designee by a date to be set by said President, from which the President shall appoint all Head Coaches.

All Head Coaches in the tackle divisions must have been an Assistant Coach for at least one season at the Hobe Sound Ravens or another youth tackle football organization before gaining a Head Coach position.

All Assistant Coach applications shall be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval.

Certifications

All Coaches must be certified by the NYSCA prior to date set forth by the President. The cost and scheduling of certification shall be the responsibility of each individual Coach.

All Coaches must complete any additional certifications/training as deemed by the Board of Directors.

Coach Requirements & Responsibilities

All Head Coaches and Assistant Coaches are required to set a positive example of honesty, responsibility and good sportsmanship.

Drugs, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, foul language and unacceptable behavior are not permitted at practice or games.

Head Coach is responsible for himself, his assistants and his players, as well as the parents and families of the players. Any spectator behaving in an unacceptable manner will cause not only removal of themselves, but also the removal of the player/participant they are there to watch for the duration of the game.

The Head Coach is responsible for recruiting a Team Parent and insuring that his/her team fulfills their concession duty schedule, pictures, fund raising and other related functions along with returning all equipment that is issued to his/her team.

The Head Coach/Team Parent will be responsible to recruit volunteers for the following duties:

NORTH FIELD

SOUTH FIELD

VISITORS: 3 chain members –Over 18

HOME: 4 concession stand staff – Over 18

3 concession stand staff-Over 18

The Head Coach or an Assistant Coach must attend scheduled Coaches meetings. SEE DISCIPLINARY ACTION

The Head Coach or Assistant Coach shall keep a record of mandatory minimum play count for each player; this count sheet must remain in the Head Coach's possession until the conclusion of the season.

Minimum play for each player will be 5 plays per half. See minimum guidelines for coaches for penalty for non-compliance of this rule.

Coaches and/or Team Parents in the Hobe Sound Ravens program may not solicit money or accept donations from any parent for any reason unless written approval has been obtained from the BOD.

Coaches are responsible to see that no one modifies, paints, places decals or otherwise alters uniforms or equipment, unless a request to the Equipment Manager or President has been submitted in writing and approved prior to alteration.

Disciplinary Action

Any coach ejected from a game by an **Official** shall also be automatically suspended from the next scheduled game and may be subject to additional disciplinary action so ordered by the BOD.

A second ejection in the same season will result in dismissal. The Officials must notify the Board, in writing, of any ejections in order for disciplinary action to take place.

Any unsportsmanlike penalty called on the bench during a game shall be reported by the Officials to the Association President or Player Agent for further investigation.

The Head Coach may suspend a player from a game or part of a game for disciplinary reasons. In such action, the player(s) involved and their parents must be notified of the infraction on the same day of occurrence and of the reasons for the suspension.

The Player Agent must approve the suspension before it is implemented.

The Head Coach shall contact any player missing 2 consecutive practices to determine the cause.

Investigations and Rules Violations

Vice-President for the field and the Player Agent(s) shall conduct investigations.

All persons shall be notified to obtain all pertinent facts, conduct a hearing for the accused and recommend appropriate action to the Board of Directors.

The member involved shall be notified of such meeting, informed to the general nature of the charges, and given an opportunity to appear at the meeting to answer such charges.

In the event a player is involved, the President, Vice-President or Player Agent shall notify the parent.

Investigations shall commence within 24 hours after receipt of an allegation and shall be in writing to the Vice President or the Player Agent before action is taken.

The President or Vice-President shall accompany the Player Agent when delivering the outcome of any investigation.

Injuries

All injuries shall be reported to the league's Insurance Agent by the Coach within 24 hours of injury.

If a player seeks medical treatment, a release from the treating physician stating the player is "able to return to full contact football/cheerleading" must be submitted to the Player Agent prior to participation.

Players shall practice one full week after an injury if the injury required missing at least 1 week of practice.

TACKLE GAME RULES

Game Eligibility

Players must practice with their respective team for two weeks to be eligible for game play.

Players must wear all issued and approved equipment including: helmet, shoulder pads, pants, pant pads, jersey and mouthpiece. Mouthpiece must be attached to the helmet. Mouthpieces can not be clear or white in color.

All equipment must be free of defects.

There will be no change of jerseys or helmets among players once they have been issued.

If a player is classified ineligible for any reason, the Head Coach shall retain said players helmet and shoulder pads. The Head Coach shall return the helmet and shoulder pads upon conclusion of the game.

The Officials and the Player Agent must approve special equipment for each game.

Players and Coaches who are injured and on crutches or in wheelchairs may not be on the sideline and must remain in the stands unless approved by the BOD. If approval is granted, they must be at the back of the Coaches box.

In the event that a team can not field eleven (11) players on a kicking or receiving team, the opposing team shall match the other team's number of players.

If at any time during the season a team loses enough players that they can no longer field a team, the Executive Board can decide to place the remaining players on other teams within their division.

If at any time during the season a team loses enough players that they can no longer field a team,

the Executive Board can decide to allow the Coaches to assist teams within their division.

The biological parent/legal guardian shall agree to volunteer a minimum of 4 hours during the season working in either the concession or on the chain crew per child in the program as scheduled by the Team Parent. Failure to show up at their scheduled time may result in their child being benched until they arrive.

If at game time the home team does not have all of their parents in the concession or the visiting team have all of their parents on the chain crew, that team will receive a 15 yard unsportsmanlike penalty.

Weigh-In

The Player Agent or their designated assistant will conduct weigh in starting ½ hour before their scheduled game. There will be no early weigh-ins.

Player missing weigh-in: Any player not weighing in with his/her respective team shall be ineligible for that day's game.

*The Player Agent may declare a player ruled ineligible as eligible if extenuating circumstances are present. The Player Agent must be notified of the circumstances prior to or at weigh-in. The player will be weighed at the time of their arrival and prior to participation in the game. Any notification after weigh-in is completed for the team will be considered at the Player Agent's discretion. The Player Agent shall notify the opposing Head Coach of the player and circumstances whenever this occurs

If a game is canceled prior to kick off and after weigh in...another official weigh in shall take place at the makeup game.

Weights shall be taken with league issued jersey, pants, pant pads and girdle being worn.

No metal cleat tips are permitted. There shall not be any exposed metal on any cleats.

Any player not properly equipped for weigh-in/game play shall be declared ineligible for that game and subject to possible disciplinary action for player and/or Head Coach.

No jewelry (earrings, bracelets, etc) shall be worn.

Mandatory Down Lineman Rule

Players whose weight exceeds **115 lbs.** for the Lower Division and **140 lbs.** for Middle division shall be required to play as down lineman.

The Upper Division shall have no mandatory down lineman rule.

A down lineman shall be defined as offensive center, offensive guards, offensive tackles, defensive nose guard, or defensive tackles. (3 or 4 point stance)

Mandatory down linemen shall not participate in kick-offs, kick-returns, tackle eligible plays.

A mandatory down lineman may be the kicker on extra points and field goal attempts.

Defensive linemen may advance the ball by a fumble recovery or a pass interception.

Offensive down lineman may not advance the ball at any time. Defensive mandatory lineman must be in a down position on the line of scrimmage at the time of the snap. Defensive mandatory lineman shall not retreat more than two steps.

Approved ruling: If in the opinion of the Officials, a mandatory down lineman performs duties normally performed by a player other than a lineman, the Officials shall enforce an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty against the Head Coach. If a player lines up in an approved position but retreats to a position other than down lineman, that player shall be penalized for illegal participation.

A mandatory defensive down lineman cannot line up outside the offensive tackle. Exception will be with the unbalanced offensive lines where a mandatory defensive down lineman may line up no further than the gap on either side of the snapper.

All mandatory down lineman shall have suitable markings placed on the helmet at weigh-in by the Player Agent.

The marking applied by the Player Agent shall not be removed except by the Player Agent.

Marking shall remain in place until player no longer meets age/weight classifications.

Helmets of mandatory down lineman shall not be exchanged with any other player.

Rules for game Play

There shall be no form of electronic communications, cameras, video cameras, etc on the sideline at any time during the game by Coaching Staff, Players or Chain Crew.

* BOD is aware of certain circumstances where cell phone communication may be necessary. Please advise President or Player Agent prior to start of game for permission.

General rules for game play shall be as specified by the current Florida High School Activities Association (FHSAA) rules unless superseded in these rules.

Superseding of a rule need not be by specific reference to chapter and section of the FSHAA rules.

Mandatory Playing Rule

Each eligible player shall play a minimum of 5 plays per half. Kick-off, kick-off returns, punts, or extra points do qualify as plays from scrimmage.

Check section under Coaches for penalty for non-compliance of minimum play rule.

*There will be no minimum play rules for Playoff or Championship Games.

Duration of Game

Lower and Middle Divisions shall play with an eight (8) minute regulation clock and an eight (8) minute halftime unless otherwise approved by the BOD.

Upper Division shall play with a ten (10) minute regulation clock and an eight (8) minute halftime unless otherwise approved by the BOD.

Regular season games shall end at the conclusion of the 4th quarter unless the score is tied. Then a Kansas City Tie Breaker will take place.

All games, including Playoffs and Championships shall use tie breaking system as described by FSHAA rules.

Extrapoints are awarded as follows:

Kicked = 2 points

Passed = 2 points **the ball must be passed beyond the line of scrimmage.

Run in for extra point = 1 point

Time Outs

Each team shall have a maximum of three time outs per half.

Timeout for player injury shall be charged to the Officials. The injured player must be removed for at least one play.

Timeouts shall be 40 seconds in duration.

Mercy Rule

Playoff and Championship Games are not subject to Mercy Rule guidelines.

After a team goes ahead by 18 points, the leading team cannot pass. All plays must be direct handoffs.

After a team goes ahead by 24 points, the Head Coach of the team that is behind must remove four players from the opposing team. The players will be removed after the extra point. Once the selection of the four players is made, that selection remains in effect for the remainder of the game.

There can be no more than two (2) linemen chosen to be removed

If/when this needs to be implemented then the Official will call a one (1) minute time out.

**The players are removed from offense only. They may continue to play defense and special teams.*

Once a game reaches a 24 point difference, there will no longer be any kick offs by either team for the duration of the game regardless of the future score.

The ball will be set for play on your own 40 yard line.

INTENT: To prevent demoralization of one team by another and to use this situation to allow less experienced players to get additional game experience.

If the scoring differential drops below eighteen (18) points, players may again resume their

normal first-string positions and normal play resumes.

If at the end of the 3rd quarter, the scoring differential is twenty-four (24) points or greater, the game clock shall be a running clock. The clock will be stopped only for injuries and charged time outs.

Game Play

The Home Team on the South field comes from the east goal post.

The Home Team from the North Field comes from the South

Only the team, Head Coach, up to 4 Certified Assistants and a water boy/girl (must be under 16 years of age) are permitted on the sidelines. No other persons affiliated with either team are allowed in the area during a game, including the team sponsor.

At no time should parents or relatives go beyond the spectator fence and enter the field of play, even during the suspected injury to a player unless called by a Board Member.

Coaches and players must remain between the 25-yard lines along the sidelines and off the field of play during game play.

All team players and sideline attendees shall remain orderly on the sidelines.

No games of ball throwing are allowed, except for warm-up as directed by the Head Coach. Warm-up shall be done behind the bench area.

Teams shall not meet behind end zone prior to the last two (2) minutes of the current game.

Teams shall leave the playing area immediately following the game.

Post-game meetings should be held outside track area.

Any team not cleaning up their sideline area after a game will be assessed disciplinary action.

Teams may not assemble more than one (1) hour before their scheduled game.

Pertaining to the last game of the day at each field, the winning team shall tear down the field and deliver the equipment to the designated storage areas in an orderly fashion. IF NOT, a penalty shall be imposed.

In the event of inclement weather as declared by the Officials or if the Lightning Meter sounds, no coach shall excuse/dismiss their team until instructed to do so by the BOD.

In the event of inclement weather as declared by the Officials or if the Lightning Meter sounds players are to be instructed to take shelter under the Pavilion or in their vehicle until released by the BOD or games resume.

If a game has not resumed by the time of the next scheduled game, the delayed game will be rescheduled.

SPRING SEASON ONLY

SPRING TEAMS

All spring teams will follow the division and age/weight requirements set forth by the FSYFL. This information will be available on the Hobe Sound Ravens website as soon as they are released by the FSYFL this fall.

Spring Rosters

As of the spring 2016 roster sizes will be capped to a minimum of (13) players and a maximum of (20) players. If there is an abundance of players, we will allow two or more teams per division.

Amount of Players

The maximum number of players the Hobe Sound Ravens can support through equipment rentals with by (180) participants. If players have their own equipment, a black helmet and shoulder pads, they will be able to participate and the number of participants in the program will exceed the Hobe Sound Ravens capped capacity.

Equipment Rental Policy

As of fall 2015, the Hobe Sound Ravens will require a \$35 non-refundable equipment rental fee.
